Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the second part of the Autumn Term. We are very pleased with the children's success in settling into their new class, becoming more independent and getting down to hard work. We have a full and exciting term ahead and we hope the children will continue to enjoy their time in Year 3.

This half term, we will conclude our 'Scavengers and Settlers' topic and we will then be looking at 'How Humans Work'. We shall explore this topic through a range of subjects.

English:

In English, we will be continuing our Power of Reading on Ted Hughes' 'The Iron Man' and then we will look at Anthony Browne's 'Into the Forest'. We will look at writing recounts, narratives and persuasive writing as well as looking at using paragraphs, punctuating speech correctly and using more ambitious vocabulary.

Maths:

In Maths we will be looking at:

- Doubling and halving numbers up to 100
- Understanding fractions, how to find fraction of amounts, comparing fractions
- Recognising and knowing the value of 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p and £1 coins, combining amounts to make particular values; matching different combinations of coins to make equal amounts, adding and subtracting money of the same unit and solving money problems in a practical context
- Choosing an appropriate instrument to measure a length and use a ruler to estimate, measure and draw to the nearest centimeter and knowing 1 litre = 1000 ml; estimate and measure capacity in millilitres
- Revising times-tables learned and deriving division facts, performing division with remainders, choosing a mental strategy to solve additions and subtractions and solve word problems

Science

In Science, we'll be finding out:

- That we need light in order to see
- How we can make and hear sounds
- How human teeth compare to animal teeth
- How our body uses food and water
- How our heart works to keep us alive
- All about skeletons and muscles
- About the human life cycle
- Why exercise is good for us
- How tobacco and alcohol harm the body
- Which foods keep us healthy and why
- About people's health problems

Technology

In Technology, we'll be finding out:

- What a healthy meal might look like
- What makes a healthy meal healthy
- How to plan and prepare a healthy meal

RE:

We shall be concluding our topic on The Bible by looking at what The Bible teaches about faith and what faith means to us as well as how Christians have shown faith and show faith today in spreading the 'Good News'.

ICT:

In ICT, we'll be finding out:

- How some people use ICT as part of their job as well as in their daily lives
- How to use ICT responsibly and stay safe online
- How to find reliable information from a range of sources including the internet
- How to use ICT to present things we have found out in an exciting and engaging way
- How to write algorithms to make things happen in digital games
- How to debug scripts and programs in digital games
- How to design, code, create and market our own digital games

ART:

Mrs Forsyth will provide specialist teaching of Art lessons. This half term we will be painting and will learn about complementary colours and learn how to use create and use different tones of the same colour.

Music:

This half term we will be linking in with their class topic of How Humans Work by using songs about the skeleton and our muscles to learn about musical structure. We will be performing call and response songs and creating word rhythms through body percussion as well as exploring different sounds, using our skeleton as our inspiration. We will be singing in two parts and developing an understanding of and performing in binary form and we will be rehearsing songs for our Christmas nativity.

PE:

Year 3 will be participating in PE lessons on a Tuesday, with Mr Ellis and on a Wednesday with Miss Barrett. This half term's activity will be football. Pupils will focus on dribbling with changes in speed and direction, performing a short pass and moving into space. In addition the class will practice shooting at goal and link dribbling, passing and receiving. These skills will be applied through a range of co-operative and competitive games.

PSHE:

Our theme is *Celebrating Difference*. We will look at how families are different, dealing with differences and conflicts, the role of witnesses in bullying, words that harm and how our words can affect others.

FRENCH

We will continue to learn French with Madame Cox every Monday, reinforcing what we have already learned and adding to our vocabulary.

READING

Each child will be part of a *Guided Reading Group* where they will take part in shared reading. We will discuss the book and complete a focused learning task based around the text. This task will be completed in our quiet reading sessions in the week. They should also have a book to read in our independent reading sessions. This may be one from the classroom or one from home. Please ensure that books brought from home are of a suitable level for your child. Children are expected to read at home every night for at least 15 minutes.
