

PE and Sport Premium Spending 2015-2016

Equipment

During the school year £1790.94 of Sport Funding and £ 5383.00 PE Premium Funding has been spent on:

- 1) Covering staff attending a variety of PPSSA and Wandsworth Sports Competitions.
- 2) Covering the initial shortfall in coaching costs associated with new extra-curricular sports clubs.
- 3) Covering the annual subscription for Skills 2 Achieve Assessment Toolkit.
- 4) Hiring Barn Elms Athletics Track for Year 5 and Year 6 Summer Term Athletics Lessons.
- 5) Covering the monthly subscription cost for 5 a day TV.
- 6) Hiring Putney Swimming Pool for trials.
- 7) Covering the cost of replenishing and further improving PE equipment supplies.

Funding has been used to ensure staff can be released from lessons, to take groups of children to competitions, by paying for cover teachers. This has increased the number of competitive opportunities on offer to children and consequently the number of individuals representing the school. In turn children have had the opportunity to develop interests in different sports, apply skills learnt in lessons, experience and demonstrate sporting values.

Funding has been used to cover any shortfall in the costs associated with paying coaches to deliver new extra-curricular clubs. This has provided the opportunity to trial and start clubs irrespective of initial uptake. Consequently there has been a period of time where interest and numbers have built allowing these clubs to become established and self-sustaining. In addition funding has been used to cover the costs of a second coach in targeted sessions. In these clubs all pupils who apply can attend rather than a capped number. Consequently we have seen an increase in the number of KS1 and KS2 pupils participating extra-curricular activities.



Funding has been used to pay the annual subscription for the Skills 2 Achieve PE Assessment Toolkit. This has provided a suitable platform on which to log and monitor pupils achievements. As such progress can be tracked more effectively and target groups identified to further raise standards.



Funding has been used to pay the monthly subscription for 5 a Day TV. This is an interactive aerobic dance programme that classes follow when participating in their Early Morning Physical Activity. The programme ensures that sessions are structured and enjoyable. Early Morning Physical Activity is a valued routine within the school day. Pupils benefit from the positive impact that physical activity has on brain function and meet the government recommended level of curricular physical activity each week.



Funding has been used to pay for the hire of Barn Elms Athletics Track. Year 5 and Year 6 classes had their PE lessons here in the summer term. This gave pupils the opportunity learn and use skills in a different environment. Access to these facilities also helped us to extend skills previously acquired. Most notably pupils were able to develop their run up for the long jump, scissor technique for the high jump, discus throwing technique and pacing around a 400-metre track. These sessions helped us to prepare individuals for Sports Day, to assess pupil's athletic ability and to select teams for District Sports.

Funding has been used to pay for the hire of Putney Swimming Pool in the Spring Term. All KS2 pupils were invited to attend a trial. This trial helped us to assess pupil's swimming ability and to select teams for Putney Mini and Main Swimming Galas.

Funding has been used to replenish and improve PE equipment supplies. As a result teachers can continue to deliver well-resourced lessons that cater for all individuals.

The following planned actions, funded through the PE and Sport Premium, weren't completed in 2015-2016 due to unforeseen circumstances:
