## Get Vaccinated - Don't Catch Measles!

**About Measles:** Measles is a highly infectious viral illness spread by coughs and sneezes. If you are not protected and have contact with someone who has measles, the chances are that you will be infected too.

**Symptoms:** Fever, sore red eyes and rash. In some cases measles can result in serious complications. It is important to protect yourself and your child.

**Complications:** Chest and ear infections, fits, diarrhoea, encephalitis (infection of the brain) and brain damage.

### How do I protect myself from Measles?

**MMR vaccination is the only way to protect against measles.**

MMR stands for Measles Mumps and Rubella, the vaccine also protects against mumps and rubella. The vaccine is safe.

**Teenagers and adults who have missed one or both of their MMR vaccinations can get measles. Speak to your GP.**

You will only be protected if you have had two doses of the vaccine.

**1st dose: 12 months old. 2nd dose: From 18 months old.**

(in some areas this is done at pre-school age, from 3 years and 4 months)

If you or your child has not had any or both doses of MMR you need to book an appointment with your GP as soon as possible.
