#### The Curriculum

Your child will now follow the national curriculum's Upper Key Stage Two programme of study. However, to help cover identified gaps or missed learning from the pandemic in the previous year, we will also go over key objectives deemed essential for progression. This will likely take the form of review or catch up sessions prior to starting any new content for the Year 5 curriculum.

PE Arrangements

This year your child's PE lessons will take place every **Monday** and **Wednesday**. Your child can attend school on these days wearing the St. Mary's PE kit. If your child takes part in a school sports club before or after school on a **non-PE** day, they are required to change i.e. sports club before school then bring school uniform to change into and after school bring PE kit to get changed into.

Home Learning
<b>Maths:</b> Set on Friday via Microsoft Teams and should be handed in the following Wednesday. Most maths home learning will link with Mathematics and should take on average 30-40 minutes.
<b>English:</b> Set on Friday via Microsoft Teams, to be handed in remotely on Wednesday
<b>Spellings:</b> Word lists given at the start of the term. Tested on Friday
<b>Reading:</b> Daily for at least 15 minutes each evening
<b>Times Tables:</b> Tested on Friday
<b>Home learning will not be set during holidays</b>
