Reception: Half-Termly Letter to Parents

Spring 1 January 2022

Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s),

Welcome back! We hope you have all had a lovely Christmas holiday and are looking forward to the half term ahead.

The Curriculum

This half term we will be using the book "Let's All Creep Through Crocodile Creek" by Jonny Lambert as a starting point for our learning. Further to this we will be thinking about journeys more broadly as we learn across all areas of the curriculum.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

This half term our focus is 'Dreams and Goals.' The class will be doing regular sessions to think further about having a positive attitude, working well with others, helping others to achieve their goals, keeping going even when we find things difficult and working hard to achieve their own goals and dreams.

Physical Development (PD)

The class will continue to develop their fine and gross motor skills. They will be developing their pencil control through mark making, fine motor and handwriting activities. Handwriting will continue to be sent home weekly. Please complete this with your children, encouraging them to hold their pencil with a tripod grip and form the letters correctly.



PE lessons will be taught by Coach Park, on Mondays, and by Miss de Souza on a Thursday.

This half term in PE pupils will focus on movement and balance. They will learn to jump from height and land safely, maintain balance while moving along apparatus and travel in different ways on hands and feet. In addition the class will practice making different shapes, controlling objects and holding positions on large and small body parts. Skills will be applied through a range of co-operative games. **As last term children should come into school on Mondays and Thursdays in their PE kit. They do not need a change of clothes.**

Communication and Language (C&L)

Our focus book this half term is book "Let's All Creep Through Crocodile Creek." Through it we will be looking at some new descriptive vocabulary and encouraging the children to use these new words and phrases in their own play and talk. We will be using our wider theme of journeys to talk about, and describe, new places and act out our journeys there. **If you and your family have been on any recent journeys, big or small, we would love to hear about them! Drop Miss de Souza an email with some photos and details!**

Literacy

The children are whizzing through the different letter sounds. Please continue to use your child's sound book daily to consolidate their learning, as the last graphemes and digraphs are added over this half term. We will then be consolidating the sounds learnt, and applying their phonic knowledge when blending and segmenting. Our focus in writing will be on accurately writing CVC words, doing this through a variety of tasks linked to our focus book. Please practice reading your child's word lists and books regularly throughout the week, and **please let us know how they are getting on with their reading at home via the Reading Record Book.** If you have any queries about reading and phonics please do email Miss de Souza, and see the attached notes in the reading folders. Please note

that only reading materials should be kept in the reading folder - handwriting sheets and other work should be separate for easy collection.

Mathematics

In our number work we will be continuing to create a secure foundation for the children's mathematics. We follow a Maths Mastery approach, which really focuses on a deep understanding of number. Rather than counting 'high' we explore what is really going on within small numbers. This half term children will be increasing confidence with subitising within 5 (seeing the amount and knowing how many there without having to count) to explore patterns within 5, including patterns showing small groups and 'one more'. We will develop our verbal counting to 20 and beyond, and develop our accuracy when counting or representing numbers between 5 and 10. We will be exploring the composition of 5 in greater detail, and starting to look at composition of numbers within 10 being '5 and a bit'. Finally we will be continuing to use the language of comparison (words 'the same', 'equal', 'more', and 'fewer' (nb not 'less!')), and exploring how to make different groups equal.

Understanding the World

Through our wider theme we will be focusing on the wider world, and starting to talk about different countries and places, learning about lives and cultures that are different from our own. We will use journeys to start talking about maps and what they represent.

RE

The class will be learning about why Christians believe Jesus is special. They will be learning that Jesus is God's son, the miracles he performed and that he teaches people to love others.

Expressive Art and Design

In addition to our class based activities the class will also have discrete music and art lessons with a specialist teacher every Tuesday.

Reception Routines and Information

Lunch - Food and Allergies

St Mary's is a healthy school, so we ask that children do not bring in chocolate to school, or in their packed lunches. We will have to remove these items until the end of the day.

Another important reminder: **PLEASE ENSURE NO NUTS OR SESAME ARE BROUGHT INTO SCHOOL.** We are a nut free school, and we have children with severe nut and sesame allergies. Please remember nuts and sesame are often in cereal bars, pesto, hummus and on/in bread/bagels etc. Always check the label before sending food into school.

Donations

The class are starting to use more and more recycling for their junk modelling creations, and our supplies are rather low! We would love some donations of **clean and dry recycling materials** throughout the term (boxes, cartons etc - the more unusual shapes the better! but please no tin or glass). Please bring these to me at the end of the day, or send them in with your child one morning.

If you are discarding any **old clothes** please consider donating them to the Early Years: we are particularly short on spare socks and shoes!

School Trips

We are hoping to plan some school trips going forward but will need volunteers - **if any parents/carers would like to volunteer and have a current DBS check with the school please let us know.** We cannot take anyone without a DBS through St Mary's School - please contact Mrs Abraham in the office to apply for one, as soon as you can, as they take a few weeks to process.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Thank you for your support with the new morning drop off arrangements - it is working really well for the children!

Home Learning Arrangements and What Your Child Will Need Each Day

Children's rectangular book bags should be brought into school every day, including their reading folder. This is really helpful for us as we seek to support your child's early reading.

Please make sure you check the book bags every time they come home in case there are letters and important information for you. *Children should not bring any toys, books or food with them - we have everything they need.* **Please keep only the reading materials within the zipped reading folder. Handwriting home learning, as well as other items, should be kept separate for easy collection.**

It is expected that children will read aloud and/or practice their letter sounds every night for at least 15 minutes at this crucial stage of learning to read. **Your child's reading will be really impacted by short, regular practice at home together, and we really recommend finding a time that works for you as a family for daily reading practice, even before reading books themselves start to come home.**

Monday:	Children should come to school in their St Mary's <u>PE kit</u> , and suitable footwear. They do not need a change of clothes.
Tuesday:	Normal day
Wednesday:	<u>Home learning</u> (handwriting sheets) should be returned completed in your child's book bag.
Thursday:	Children should come to school in their St Mary's PE kit , and suitable footwear. They do not need a change of clothes. <i>Red and Yellow Family's Reading Day (We cannot read with your child without their reading folder)</i>
Friday:	<i>Green and Blue Family's Reading Day (We cannot read with your child without their reading folder)</i> New <u>home learning</u> (handwriting sheets) will be set and placed in your child's book bag. These should be completed by the following Wednesday.

Please ensure every item of your child's uniform is clearly labelled, including hats, scarves and gloves! We also spend lots of time outdoors, so please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather!

Communication


