**Nursery: Half Termly Letter to Parents**

**Spring 2 February 2022**

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back everybody; we hope you have all had a restful and relaxing break! The children have been sharing lots about what they have been up to in the holidays!

This week we have started our new topic for the half term:

**PLANTS AND FLOWERS**

Throughout this topic your child will have the opportunity to:

Grow some flowers/plants of their own

Make a garden for the Nursery, and look at things that are growing around the school

Play in our Garden Centre role play area

Explore plant related books

We are hoping to add to our outside area by growing plants and vegetables. If anybody could donate any spare soil, old tools, seeds or cuttings, or indeed empty seed packets for our role play area, we would be extremely grateful.

**Curriculum**

**Communication and Language**

Our Plants and Flowers topic will allow children to learn and use a new area of vocabulary, enhanced by lots of stories around the topic. Children will be encouraged to use their knowledge as they 'go shopping' in the Garden Centre and observe the plants outside.

We will expose them to more 'how' and 'why' questions in carpet and small group sessions and help children to respond to instructions involving a two-part sequence.

**Physical Development**

We will continue to develop the children's fine and gross motor skills within Nursery. There will be opportunities to write, paint and mark make within the Garden Centre, as they create shopping lists and fill in flower order forms. We are continuing to practice name writing.

Nursery will also take part in PE lessons with Mrs Davidson on Wednesdays, or with Mrs Dunford on Fridays, and will start to move in different ways using different animal walks.

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development**

We will be learning about how to be healthy and look after ourselves, including thinking about our bodies, exercise, the risks we take, and healthy eating.

We will also continue to develop children's understanding of taking turns and sharing. In addition we will cultivate children's ability to use their words to initiate and join in play with their peers.

### Literacy

We will continue to broaden the children's knowledge of fiction and non-fiction books around the topic of Plants and Flowers. We will focus on "Jack and the Beanstalk", "I Will Not Ever Eat a Tomato", "Jasper's Beanstalk", "A Seed in Need" and "Oliver's Vegetables" and "Errol's garden" to name a few. We look forward to planting some of the plants in the books with the children!

If you have any further books related to plants and flowers please do bring them in (labelled) so we can share them with the class!

Nursery will continue to explore and practise rhyme, both recognising words that rhyme and completing a rhyming string. Please do reinforce this at home as it takes lots of practice whilst reading books and singing songs!

### Maths

The children will be introduced informally to the basic language of money using our new role play area. The Garden Centre will also allow many opportunities for sorting, counting and number recognition, on price labels for instance.

We are so pleased with the development in the children's one-to-one correspondence when counting. We are starting to encourage children to have a go at representing numbers through mark making - this may be through tallies or dots, which really contributes to a child's developing sense of number. We will continue to practise comparing different amounts, using the words 'the same', 'more' and 'fewer'.

In Shape Space and Measure our trip to the garden centre and our role play area will allow us to explore the exchange of money. We will also continue to use mathematical names for describing 2D shapes and consolidate our recognition and use of them in pictures and designs.

### Understanding the World and RE

A major focus of our theme is learning about the natural environment and the children will have the opportunity through practical experience to learn how to take care of it. Throughout the topic we will be observing, recording and talking about plants and flowers, particularly noticing differences, growth, decay and changes over time. Due to our topic we will use some of our cooking time and donations for growing different seeds and plants.

### Expressive Art and Design

Using plants and flowers as our theme, we will be continuing to develop the children's musical awareness through singing known songs associated with growing things, as well as learning new ones and playing singing games. By putting actions to the words, the children will develop their sense of pulse and we will explore more of the musical elements when singing the songs, for example tempo and dynamics. We will also focus on practising their listening skills through moving to music and introducing sung instructions.

We will also be doing exciting artwork inspired by Plants and Flowers, including observational drawing, using seeds to create a mosaic, and using 2D shapes to build up a picture. We will concentrate on drawing a shape and then colouring it in, as well as selecting colours for a purpose.

## WHAT YOUR CHILD NEEDS FOR NURSERY

Uniform can be ordered and collected from the office (or school website). Each child will also need a named bag for their peg containing a **complete change of clothes** inside - spare shoes are often needed too in case of an 'accident' or wet play - please include these too. This should be kept in school at all times and will go home only when it is needed. **It is very important that ALL of your child's clothes are labelled, including shoes, socks and coats! They all look the same to us! P**

Please be patient if items of uniform are missing or have been taken home by another child. The Nursery team will always look for them and aim to get them back to you as soon as possible. We know this can be frustrating but we are trying to teach to the children to be more independent (getting and putting on their own coat etc.) and sometimes items of uniform can get muddled - they all look the same!

### Please send your child into school with:

- a labelled water bottle that they can drink from independently - EVERYDAY
- a book bag once a week - WEDNESDAY ONLY

### Lunch - Food and Allergies

St Mary's is a healthy school, so we ask that children do not bring in chocolate to school, or in their packed lunches. We will have to remove these items until the end of the day.

Another important reminder: **PLEASE ENSURE NO NUTS OR SESAME ARE BROUGHT INTO SCHOOL**. We are a nut free school, and we have children with severe nut and sesame allergies. Please remember nuts and sesame are often in cereal bars, pesto, hummus and on/in bread/bagels etc. Always check the label before sending food into school.

### Home Learning Arrangements

Home Learning will be set on a Wednesday and will be due the following Wednesday.

There will be weekly home learning as follows:

- **Reading:** Every child will take home a fiction or non-fiction text that your child will choose weekly on a Wednesday. Your child will receive a folder and a reading record card. Please fill in the reading card weekly and return the folder and book on the following Wednesday. Please only bring these books in on WEDNESDAY!
- We have displayed the family photos from last half term in our role-play area. If you have not already sent in a photo please could you send one in via email and we can add it to the display. The children have really enjoyed looking and talking about these photos.

### Communication

**If there are important messages** e.g. a query for the Nursery team, or letting us know about pick up arrangements **please email [classnursery@st-marys-putney.wandsworth.sch.uk](mailto:classnursery@st-marys-putney.wandsworth.sch.uk) before 9am: these will be checked once a day. A message after this should be emailed or phoned into the school office.** **If the child is going home with someone not known to the Nursery staff we must be notified in advance otherwise we cannot release your child until we have spoken to you.** More information is in the Nursery Handbook.

We will also send important information back via the email address. Please make sure this email address is saved so it does not go into your junk folder, and **please note any messages each night, as it may be about school the next day.**
