Welcome

We warmly welcome you to St. Mary's Church for the joyous occasion of the bicentenary of our parish school, St. Mary's Church of England Primary School, which was founded by this church on 20th February 1819. We would like everyone to feel at home here as we give thanks today for our wonderful school which has proudly served the parish of Putney for over 200 years.

St. Mary's Church

There has been a centre for Christian worship on this site since the 13th century. The parts of the medieval church which survive today are the tower, some of the nave arcading (mid 15th century) and the Bishop West Chapel, built in the early 16th century by Putney resident, Nicholas West. During the Civil War the headquarters of Oliver Cromwell's army was briefly in Putney. In 1647 meetings of the Army Council were held in the church. These discussions on the future government of the country were called the 'Putney Debates.' In 1973 an arson attack gutted much of the church. Rebuilding was completed when the church was re-hallowed by the Bishop of Woolwich on 6th February 1982.

St. Mary's School

Originating as a Sunday School, run by St. Mary's Church, it was in 1819 that a deed for land donated by Earl Spencer made it possible for the church to have its own school building 'situated in a part of a field of two acres in the back lanes of Putney.' St Mary's School was created as a 'National School' by the 'National Society for Promoting the Education of the Poor in the Principles of the Established Church in England and Wales.' It is the oldest of the Parochial and National schools founded for 'the benefit of the labouring classes of Putney.' The hall block, fronted by a garden on Charlwood Road, is thought to be the oldest part of the school.

In 1833 the first government funds were given to schools and this enabled St. Mary's School to develop and grow. In 1867 a Miss Williams of Wandsworth left St. Mary's School a large sum of money which was used to provide new classrooms for both the Infants' School and Girls' School. The Second World War was one of the most traumatic times for St. Mary's School – an incendiary bomb crashed through the roof of the Girls' Upper School one night, setting the building ablaze!

In April 2003 work began on an extensive expansion of the main school building to create a new first floor equipped with three new modern and spacious classrooms and larger staff room. In February 2004 the expansion and restoration work of the school was complete and St. Mary's School was rededicated by the Bishop of Southwark. In April 2017 further work saw the addition of a new Year Six classroom and the refurbishment of the school's nursery and reception classrooms.
