Home Learning Arrangements

There will be weekly home learning as follows:

Home Learning

All home learning is set on Friday to be returned/completed by the following Wednesday

Maths: Children to complete assigned online tasks on Mathletics

Dictation: Dictation covers the spelling pattern from the previous week to check that your child can recall the spelling rule and not just rote learn for the test. The due dates are written on the cards to help you! The dictation helps us to see what your child has been able to retain and what we might need to go over again so please do not let your child see the card before writing and please do leave in any mistakes that your child might make.

Grammar: reinforcement sheets will be sent home during the week, for the children to complete and to let you know what we have been covering in class. These are for your reference and do not need to be returned.

Handwriting: Handwriting reinforcement is to be completed using the Letter Join online program (login: 1j9376 password: home). As the children have very different needs with regard to handwriting, I recommend you go into the Year 2 folder and choose an appropriate letter pattern each week, to suite your child's ability. In class we are focusing on correct posture for handwriting, basic pattern formation and horizontal and diagonal joins.

Spellings: Spelling are tested on Friday. Please ensure that your child brings their spelling card to school on a **Friday** so that we can mark down their score for you to see how they did and what they might need to work on.

Reading:

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The more you read, the more you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you will go!

Reading is a primary focus of the school and Year 2. I have noticed a dip in the regularity in which the children are reading each week. To encourage reading every day, on a Wednesday evening, reading journals will be checked and a sticker awarded for children who have read more than 5 times. After they receive 3 stickers, they will be given 10 family points and a star on the class reward chart.

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We expect that children will read aloud every night for <u>at least 10 minutes</u>. Inside the front and back covers of the books, there are useful questions to ask your child to probe their understanding of the text. Please refer to these before, during and after reading together. Reading folders should be brought into school <u>every day</u> in order to enable us to read with your child at school as well. Every week, all children will read with an adult (whether the class teacher, teaching assistant or a volunteer) either during a guided reading session or individually (depending on your child's reading needs). All children will read with the class teacher every other week during a guided reading session. Reading books are changed on a <u>Wednesday evening</u>. We will keep reading folders overnight on a Wednesday and they will be returned home every <u>Thursday</u> after book change. Please ensure that you write in the Reading Record when your child needs new books, otherwise they will not be changed! Books are changed, if requested, on <u>WEDNESDAYS ONLY</u>. We cannot guarantee that books can be changed after this. Any other comments or feedback regarding your child's reading is always welcome via the online PACT book.
