Year 4: Half-Termly Letter to Parents Summer Term 1, April 2024

Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s),

I trust that you all had a wonderful Easter holiday! Year 4 have an exciting half term ahead. This term in RE, our class have an exciting opportunity to take a trip to the St Paul's Cathedral to build more of an understanding of why people of a Christian faith go on pilgrimages. Children will also have the opportunity to walk up to the Dome to practice their own pilgrimage reflecting on whether the journey or the destination is more important to Christians. We will shortly be finishing our rainforest topic in Geography before beginning our History topic, looking at Anglo-Saxons! Furthermore, we will be investigating the functions of animals and humans; exploring how the digestive system works, including teeth; the children will be in for an interesting experiment following this ... In English we will be exploring the wonderful book; 'Where the Forest Meets the Sea' by Jeannie Baker which focuses on the timelessness of the natural environment and the wonders of the rainforest. This will lead the children into independent research for their own information boards on the rainforests.

PE Arrangements

PE lessons will continue to take place every Tuesday and Thursday. Your child can attend school on these days wearing the St. Mary's PE kit. If your child takes part in a school sports club before or after school on a non-PE day, they are required to change i.e. sports club before school please bring school uniform to change into and after school bring PE kit to get changed into.

Please ensure your child's PE kit (and suitable footwear - trainers for outdoors) is in school on Tuesdays and Thursdays - labelled clearly.

Home Learning Arrangements

Home Learning will be mostly set as an assignment via Microsoft Teams. Please ensure your child has access to Microsoft Teams and is able to meet the deadlines for completion. There will be weekly home learning as follows:

Spellings: Spelling cards will be shared at the start of each half term. Weekly spellings set on Monday and tested on Friday. Children have a spare copy of this in their tidy-trays.

 - **Reading:** Daily to be listened to by an adult for at least 15-20 minutes each morning or evening. It is important that the children read aloud to you regularly and they also benefit greatly from you reading to them. Reading things such as articles in encyclopedias, newspapers, recipes, instruction texts, etc. will help broaden their understanding of reading across different contexts. Encourage your child to have one non-fiction book and one fiction book between home and school!
 - Maths: Set on Friday via Microsoft Teams and handed in the following Wednesday. Most maths home learning will link with Mathletics and should take on average 30-40 minutes.
 - English: Set on Friday via Microsoft Teams and handed in the following Wednesday. English tasks should take on average 30-40 minutes.
