PE Arrangements

PE lessons continue to take place every **Monday** and **Tuesday**. Your child can attend school on these days wearing the St. Mary's PE kit. If your child takes part in a school sports club before or after school on a **non-PE** day, they are required to change i.e. sports club before school then bring school uniform to change into and after school bring PE kit to get changed into.

Home Learning

In Year 6, all children will be given three home learning tasks to complete each week - Math's SATS Revision Test/ English Comprehension/Guided Reading.

We advise children to spend no more than 40 minutes on each piece of main home learning and to let us know whether they found it too complicated or too easy at the end of the assignment. We expect all of our Year 6 children to complete their home learning independently but it would be beneficial for them to have it checked over for accurate punctuation, accurate calculations and neatness before it is handed in. Please comment if you have had to help significantly.

Home learning is structured as followed:

Home Learning
Math's Revision Paper: Set on Friday to be handed in on Wednesday
English Comprehension Task: Set on Friday to be handed in on Wednesday
Guided Reading: Reading and task to be completed
Spellings: Spelling Cards given at the start of the term. Tested on Friday Independent Reading: Daily for at least 30 minutes each evening
Times Tables: Tested on Friday 100 Club sheets have been sent to parents to use at home to aid fluency and speed!
Home learning will not be set during holidays

School Journey Residential Trip

Year 6 will attend their school journey trip to Sayers Croft from Tuesday 28th January to Friday 31st January. A parent information meeting about Sayers Croft took place on Thursday 9th January at 6pm in the Y6 classroom. This will be very similar to last year's meeting which many of you attended in Y5, but if you were not able to attend, please have a look at the slides that have been sent out via email.

Secondary School's National Offer Day

Just a reminder that if you applied online for a state secondary school you will have been emailed the outcome of your application on the evening of **1 March 2025** from the London eAdmissions Team. You will also have been sent a follow-up notification email from Wandsworth Council if it has not been possible to offer your first preference school. This will provide detailed information about the outcome of your application and what to do next.

If you applied on a paper form and provided an email address you will have been emailed the outcome of your application on the evening of **1 March 2025**. Otherwise, you will have been sent a notification outcome letter by first class mail on **1 March 2025**.
