

PE Arrangements This year your child's PE lessons will take place every Monday and Friday. Your child should come to school on these days wearing the St. Mary's PE kit and appropriate shoes. If your child takes part in a school sports club before or after school on a non-PE day, they are required to change i.e. sports club before school then bring school uniform to change into and after school bring PE kit to get changed into. PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD'S PE KIT (AND SUITABLE FOOTWEAR - TRAINERS FOR OUTDOORS) IS IN SCHOOL ON MONDAYS AND THURSDAYS AND IS LABELLED CLEARLY WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME. School Trips We plan to conduct several school trips over the course of the academic year to complement your child's learning experience. During the autumn term, we plan for Year 1 to visit a local restaurant 8 No. 20 in Putney - to aid their learning in DT on cooking and nutrition where they will be learning to know where and how fruit and vegetables grow, taste different foods, describe appearance, smell and taste, use cooking skills such as chopping and conclude with making a smoothie. This trip is covered by the local permission slip. If you would like to volunteer as a helper on a school trip, you must hold a DBS with the school and have taken part in our volunteer induction. Please contact the school office for details on how to become a school volunteer. To support our science learning on materials and their real-world applications, Year 1 will have an exciting trip to Gootopia. More details on both trips to follow! Home Learning Arrangements Home Learning will be set on a Friday and will be due the following Wednesday. Please ensure you/your child has access to Microsoft Teams, as on occasions home learning will be posted via that platform. If you have misplaced your login please contact myself via the PACT email or the office who can reset/issue you login details. There will be weekly home learning as follows: Spellings: Spelling cards will be emailed. Physical copies will be sent home after the first spelling test (12th September 2025). Weekly spellings are tested on Friday. Please ensure that your child brings their spelling card to school on a Friday so that we can mark down their score for you to see how they did and what they might need to work on. **Dictation:** Dictation begins the week after the first spelling test (19th September 2025). A physical card will be sent home alongside a dictation book for your child to complete their dictation. Dictation is set on Fridays and is to be completed by the following Wednesday. The due dates will be written on the cards to help you! The dictation helps us to see what your child has been able to retain and what we might need to go over again so please do not let your child see the card before writing and please leave in any mistakes that your child might make. Grammar: reinforcement sheets will be emailed on a Friday to let you know what we have been covering in class. These are for your reference and do not need to be returned. Reading: It is expected that children will read aloud every night for at least 10 minutes. Inside the front and back covers of the Oxford Reading Tree books, there are useful questions to ask your child to probe their understanding of the text. Please refer to these before, during and after reading together. Reading folders should be brought into school every day to enable us to read with your child. Reading books will be changed on a Wednesday evening. We will keep reading folders overnight on a Wednesday and they will be returned home every **Thursday** after book change. **Could you please ensure that you** write in the Reading Journal when your child needs new books, otherwise they won't <u>be changed!</u> Books will be changed, if requested, on WEDNESDAYS ONLY. Maths: This will be set on Friday via Mathletics. Your child will be set two tasks on Mathletics which should be completed by the following Wednesday. Login details should be stapled to your child's Reading Record Book.

Communication If you have any queries about the daily routine or what your child is learning, or to inform us of other matters relating to your child (e.g. if your child is being collected by someone who does not usually collect them), then do not hesitate to get in touch with any member of the Year 1 team. As always, the best way to do this is through the use of your child's PACT e-mail. The PACT e-mail is a great tool for communication between home and school, so please do not hesitate to use it.
