Home Learning Arrangements

Home Learning will be set on a Friday and will be due the following Wednesday.

There will be weekly home learning as follows:

• Spellings: Physical copies of Spelling cards will be sent home after the first spelling test (14th November 2025). Weekly spellings are tested on Friday. Please ensure that your child brings their spelling card to school on a Friday so that we can mark down their score for you to see how they did and what they might need to work on.

- Please note that the first spelling test after each half term is an assessment check
 to see how well the children have remembered the spelling patterns, sounds, and
 tricky words covered during the previous term. After this assessment, a physical
 copy of your child's new spelling card will be sent home usually on the second
 Friday after returning from a holiday.
- Dictation: Dictation cards will be sent home the week after spelling cards and are to be completed by the following Wednesday. The due dates are written on the cards to help you! Please do not go ahead. The dictation helps us to see what your child has been able to retain and what we might need to go over again so please do not let your child see the card before writing and please do leave in any mistakes that your child might make.
- Grammar: reinforcement sheets will be sent home during the week, for the children to complete and to let you know what we have been covering in class. These are for your reference and do not need to be returned.
- Reading: We expect that children will read aloud every night for at least 10 minutes.
 Inside the front and back covers of the books, there are useful questions to ask your child to probe their understanding of the text. Please refer to these before, during and after reading together.
- Reading folders should be brought into school every day in order to enable us to read with
 your child at school as well. Every child will read with an adult (whether the class teacher,
 teaching assistant or a volunteer) every week. Every child will read with the class teacher
 every two weeks and a comment will be written in their Reading Record book. This will
 either take place in a group guided shared reading session or individually (depending on
 your child's reading needs).
- Reading books are changed on a <u>Wednesday evening</u>. We will keep reading folders overnight on a Wednesday and they will be returned home every <u>Thursday</u> after book change. Please ensure that you write in the Reading Record when your child needs new books, otherwise they will not be changed! Books are changed, if requested, on <u>WEDNESDAYS ONLY</u>. We cannot guarantee that books can be changed after this.
- Maths: This will be set on <u>Friday</u> please refer to your child's home learning book and
 complete at least one of the options. This should be completed by the following
 <u>Wednesday</u>. Please also look at Friday update emails for areas in which you could further
 support your child's learning.
